



## Physician, Obstetrics & Gynaecology and Reproductive Infectious Disease (RID) Regular Full Time Opportunity

The UBC Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology, in collaboration with BC Women's Hospital and St. Paul's Hospital, is seeking a Generalist obstetrician/gynaecologist with expertise in Reproductive Infectious Disease, for a Full Time position. While providing excellence in general obstetric and gynaecologic care, there is an expectation of at least a 0.3 FTE commitment to Reproductive Infectious Disease clinical care and research. Your practice will involve applying current research evidence and best practice standards, to deliver the highest quality of care and inform provincial policies in the area of Reproductive Infectious Disease.

Clinical care will be provided at BC Women's Hospital (obstetrics and reproductive infectious disease) and St. Paul's Hospital (gynaecologic surgical access and reproductive infectious disease). Given the dual appointment at two hospitals, you will report to the Head of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology at both sites for all clinical responsibilities, administrative and HR related matters.

For academic issues, you will report to the UBC Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology. The position will be based within the UBC Division of General Obstetrics and Gynaecology and/or the Division of Gynaecologic Specialties in order to best resource the candidate for academic success. You will participate in educational programs of the UBC Department for undergraduate medical student teaching, post-graduate resident teaching and subspecialty fellowship teaching. In addition, continuing medical education for medical and other health care professionals will be an expectation. Opportunities to participate in clinical/scientific research activities and projects, and to represent the program at the regional, provincial, national and international areas is anticipated as congruent with your career development.

As the successful applicant for this position, you will have subspecialty training in Reproductive Infectious Diseases, be eligible for certification with the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (RCPSC) and be eligible for licensure to practice from the College of Physicians and Surgeons of BC. In particular, we are seeking an individual with significant Reproductive Infectious Disease interest/skills/expertise in both clinical and academic pursuits.

Remuneration is based on a combination of fee for service and clinical service contracts agreements.
