Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology | Obstetrician and Gynaecologist

The Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology, University of British Columbia, is seeking applications for a full-time clinical faculty position in the Divisions of General Gynaecology and Obstetrics and Gynaecologic Specialties, based at St. Paul's Hospital. The opportunity includes a general obstetrics practice as part of a general and high-risk obstetrics group. The anticipated start date is June 2019 or a date to be mutually agreed upon.

In addition to general obstetrics and gynaecology, we are seeking candidates with special expertise in medical education, high-risk obstetrics, and minimally invasive surgery. The successful candidate will be comfortable working in high-risk maternity care, and willing to participate in ambulatory surgery at BC Women's Hospital. Administrative expertise and second language skills will be an advantage.

As a clinical faculty member within the Department of Obstetrics & Gynaecology, the successful candidate will be expected to participate in teaching and service obligations, at the discretion of the Division Head of Obstetrics and Gynaecology within the Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology at UBC. The incumbent will report to the Site Head of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology, and to the Division Head of General Obstetrics and Gynaecology within the Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology at UBC. Aptitudes of leadership, as well as commitment to research are also ideal qualities for the candidate. The candidate will be expected to contribute to the educational mandate of the department.

It is expected that the successful candidate will apply for and hold a clinical faculty appointment in the Department of Obstetrics & Gynaecology at the University of British Columbia. As a clinical faculty member, the successful candidate will be expected to involve learners in clinical activity, and participate in program development and student evaluation.

Applicants must be eligible for registration with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of British Columbia, be a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada and be eligible to hold a clinical faculty appointment at UBC. This position is funded by fee for service through the Medical Services Plan of British Columbia.
