Awards and Funding Opportunities

(1) **NEW!** WHRI: [Graduate Research Award in Women's Health Grant Competition](#) – Application deadline: **July 19, 2019.** *Award of \$12,500 for 1 year starting Sep 1.* This award is meant to support research and salary costs for graduate students or postdoctoral fellows who are under the supervision of a WHRI member and who are carrying out research in the area of women's or newborn's health.

(2) **NEW!** CIHR: [CIHR Sex and Gender Science Chair](#) – Application deadline: **Oct 8, 2019.** *Funding up to \$175,000 per year for 4 years is available to support applications that seek to grow the science of sex and gender research.*

(3) UBC FoM: [New Faculty Research Award](#) – Application deadline: **June 17, 2019.** *Funding up to \$10,000 is available for new recruits in the UBC Faculty of Medicine.*

(4) Mitacs: [ELEVATE Fellowship](#) – LOI & COI deadline: **June 19, 2019.** Build your career through this competitive annual fellowship for up to two years. Elevate includes a research management training program and a postdoctoral fellowship. *Your partner organization's financial contribution starts at \$30,000.*

(5) CIHR/NSERC: [2019 Collaborative Health Research Projects \(CHRP\)](#) – LOI deadline: **June 25, 2019**

The Collaborative Health Research Projects (CHRP) Initiative is expected to:

- Translate research results to knowledge/technology users (KTUs) and other stakeholders;
- Provide an opportunity for the natural sciences and/or engineering and health research communities to collaborate and integrate their expertise;
- Advance interdisciplinary research leading to knowledge and technologies;
- Benefit Canada by improving the Canadian healthcare system and/or services;
- Lead to economic growth opportunities in Canada (where appropriate); and

- Provide training opportunities for trainees in collaborative and interdisciplinary health research, while preparing them for employment opportunities in the private, public or not for profit sectors.

LOI deadline: 25th June

Full Application deadline: 29th October

Note: For the LOI stage, the PAs need to complete a [CIHR sex and gender based analysis training module](#) and upload the certificate, and the PAs and the principal knowledge technology user (KTU) will need a CIHR PIN and biosketch CCV.

Please note changes to this year's funding opportunity, e.g., LOI requirements.

(6) CIHR: [Terry Fox New Investigator Award](#) – Application deadlines: June 28, 2019 (registration to TFRI) and **Sept 13, 2019** (full proposal to TFRI & abbreviated CIHR application). This operating grant / funding opportunity is expected to support outstanding new investigators as they develop their careers as independent research scientists or clinician scientists to undertake high-quality cancer research, while in close collaboration and mentorship with specific research teams currently supported by the TFRI and CIHR. *Funding up to \$150,000 per year, for up to 3 years, for a total of \$450,000.*

(7) CIHR/NSERC/SSHRC: [Banting Canada Postdoctoral Fellowships](#) – Application deadline: July 5, 2019 (UBC internal); **September 18, 2019 (Banting).** *Prestigious 2-year fellowships, worth \$70,000 per year.*

(2) Patient Family Advisory Council (OVCARE) – next meeting will be end of June 2019

OVCARE has created a Patient and Family Advisory Council, where patients and family members are generously donating their time to become patient partners for OVCARE and the Gynecologic Cancer Initiative. Patient-oriented research has been increasingly important in health research. Engaging patients can be a transformative for patient/families but it is equally important for researchers in developing their project focus and design.

Patient partners can be involved in several ways including, but is not limited to:

- Writing support letters for grant funding
- Helping to identify overall research focus
- Consulting on specific research projects to ensure that this is fitting for the demographic
- Assisting in the design of clinical research studies by informing the patient perspective

- Identifying and developing quality improvement projects to improve the patient experience
- Assisting and consulting on the development of knowledge translation components of the research
