



Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology | Generalist Obstetrician and Gynaecologist

We are seeking applications for a Generalist Obstetrician and Gynaecologist position in the Division of General Obstetrics and Gynaecology, based at St. Paul's Hospital. This position will have obstetrical privileges at St. Paul's Hospital, and gynaecologic privileges at both St. Paul's Hospital and BC Women's Hospital. The anticipated start date is November 1st, 2021 or a date to be mutually agreed upon.

We are seeking a candidate with an outstanding track record in clinical and surgical Obstetrics and Gynaecology, with particular interest and expertise in managing complex obstetrical care. We have well-established collaborations with multiple medical services, including Cardiology, Nephrology, Haematology and Gastroenterology. Interest and experience in leadership and administration would also be an asset. This is a unique opportunity to be involved in program development for the New St. Paul's Hospital, anticipated to open in 2026/2027.

As the successful applicant for this position, you will have certification with the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (RCPS) and be eligible for licensure to practice from the College of Physicians and Surgeons of BC. The incumbent will report to the Site Department Head of Obstetrics and Gynaecology at St. Paul's Hospital for clinical issues.

As a clinical faculty member within the Department of Obstetrics & Gynaecology, the successful candidate will be expected to participate in teaching and service obligations, at the discretion of the Division Head of General Obstetrics and Gynaecology. In particular, we are seeking an individual with a strong teaching background and a commitment to clinical education. There is an expectation to participate in educational programs for undergraduate medical student teaching and post-graduate resident teaching. In addition, there is an expectation of personal dedication to the Royal College's focus on lifelong learning through professional development.

This position is funded by fee for service through the medical services plan of British Columbia, with stipends paid for clinical teaching.
